Why have a 20:20 Vision?

Informing patient choice

- We want to provide patients with information about our patient outcomes
- We want to provide information about the safety of our services
- We want to publish information about our patients' experiences

- *How could we provide information that is easy to access, use and comment on?*



Increasing demand for services

- We want to treat more patients
 - We want to provide more new treatments
 - We want to develop measures to make sure we only give treatments that improve patients' outcomes

- *Should we provide more treatment closer to patients homes and in patients homes?*
 - *How could we expand our research and provide more opportunities for patients to enter trials for new treatments?*



Global and national recession

- We want to increase our efficiency by providing more treatment at the same or less cost
- We want to ensure the treatments we provide improve outcomes for patients
- We want to invest our financial surpluses in improving the quality of our current services and providing new services

- *Should we expand our private patient work to increase income for NHS services?*
- *What other areas could we expand to increase income for our NHS services?*



NHS changes

- We want to maintain our position as an independent NHS Foundation Trust
- We want to develop relationships with new GP commissioners and the National Commissioning Board
- We want our stakeholders to support our vision

- *How could we further develop and formalise our relationships with other organisations?*
- *How could we develop closer links with other cancer centres?*
- *How could we support programmes to improve screening, early detection and prevention?*



Changes to workforce requirements

- We want to expand our school of oncology
- We want to continue participating in planning the future workforce of cancer specialists

- *How should we develop our school of oncology?*
- *How could we work closer with universities?*



Safeguarding quality

- We want to provide more personalised treatment and care for our patients
- We want our services to achieve full accreditation for all standards and inspections
- We want to provide safe services more locally for patients
- *How could we further improve the patient experience?*



Opportunities to provide services not currently at The Christie

- We want to know what other treatments and services patients would like us to provide
- *Should we carry out routine cancer surgery?*
- *Should we establish diagnostic cancer centres?*
- *Should we be providing any other cancer services?*
- *Should we provide Christie services in other parts of the country?*
